Simplot Skincredibles Class II Recall

At a Glance: J.R. Simplot Food Group has issued a Class II Recall on SKINCREDIBLES® 8 Cut Wedge Potatoes because they contain Wheat, a known food allergen, which was not disclosed on the label. A Class II Recall means there is a remote possibility of illness from consumption of the product. Persons allergic to wheat may suffer an allergic reaction.

The Issue: Food companies are required to list any of the 8 major food allergens that are contained in their products. Simplot inadvertently shipped product with an incorrect label. The recalled product is SKU 1007117923802 Skincredibles® 8 Cut Wedge Potato 6/5lb with one of the following codes:

- 006MAR311001
- 006APR191001
- 006APR201001
- 006JUL181001

Am I Impacted? If you purchased this product from U.S. Foodservice, you will be contacted directly by your local U.S. Foodservice distribution center. If you purchased this product elsewhere, please contact that supplier immediately for more information.

US Foodservice Position: Like you, we take food safety very seriously at U.S. Foodservice. We also understand the extreme sensitivity of our customers to food-related health issues and are committed to keeping our customers up to date on the latest developments as the information becomes available on this and any other product recalls in the future.

What You Can Do:

- If you have Cut Wedge Potatoes in your operation review the brand and codes noted above to see if you are affected.
- If you purchase them from US Foodservice and were contacted directly follow product disposition instructions
- If you didn't purchase them from US Foodservice contact your supplier for instructions
- Only specific lot codes are affected. Be sure to identify the lot codes and SKU
- Do not serve or use recalled items in recipes.
- Discard product so that others may not retrieve and consume it.
- Help us serve you better. Provide your distribution center with a valid email address so we may reach you with recall information.

Finally, count on U.S. Foodservice to keep you informed, and to keep recalled product out of your establishment.
